School Uniform

Uniform items are available for purchase from the school office. Our winter and general uniform includes:

- Grey shorts (Boys)
- Royal blue polo shirt (with school logo)
- Royal blue fleecy jumper (Girls & Boys)
- Royal blue fleecy track pants (Girls & Boys)
- Sport shirt (Girls & Boys)
- Black knee-length shorts/skort (Sport only)
- Wide-brimmed or bucket hat (required for outdoor play)
- Black shoes
- White or grey plain socks

Vision Screening

We are extremely thankful for the chance to have students from Kindergarten through Year 6 take part in the Lions Eye Health Program's complimentary Children's Vision Screening. The Lion's Eye Health team seen 68 of our students here at Maclean Public on Tuesday. They will return later in the year to see the students that were missed. This program facilitates early identification of common vision issues in young children, enhancing their well-being and learning. The screening is quick and non-invasive.

Depth Perception: Assesses binocular vision and how well both eyes work together.

Spot Vision Camera: Identifies potential vision issues like near-sightedness or farsightedness.

Visual Acuity: Evaluates how clearly a child can see at various distances.


Colour Vision: Checks for colour vision deficiencies.

River of Learning Art Show - "Living Along the River"

The River of Learning is an annual program at Maclean High School, held during Reconciliation Week, that fosters a deeper understanding of Indigenous culture and history among students. Through activities such as smoking ceremonies, cultural tours, and interactive workshops with Elders, the program offers immersive learning experiences grounded in the traditions of the Yaegl people. It culminates in a vibrant Celebration Day featuring traditional games, performances, and meaningful conversations that promote connection and reflection on reconciliation. Complementing this is the River of Learning Art Show, an exhibition of student and community artwork hosted at the Old Kirk Yamba Museum, which showcases cultural storytelling and strengthens ties between schools and the broader community.







On Wednesday, the students dived into National Simultaneous Storytime, where they had the privilege of reading "The Truck Cat." This event is all about celebrating the magic of books and the power of literacy! They got to explore a delightful picture book crafted by a talented Aussie author and illustrator.

Reports

The NSW Department of Education has developed a new set of reporting templates for Kindergarten to Year 10, designed to provide clearer, more concise information about each child's progress at school.

These updated templates are the result of feedback from parents and carers who expressed a desire for more straightforward and easily understood reports. The aim is to make student achievement and learning progress more accessible and meaningful for families.

Maclean Public School will be adopting this new reporting format for all Semester 1 student reports.

- Your child's report will still show their progress across all subject areas and include an overall comment from their teacher.
- Additionally, teacher comments in English and Mathematics will highlight your child's identified strengths and suggest learning goals to support their continued growth.
- A new achievement scale with clear descriptions is also included to provide a more accurate and understandable picture of your child's progress.






The boys faced Yamba and held their own throughout the game. Although they didn't come away with a win, they showed great effort and teamwork.


