As we begin week 8 of term 1, I am sharing the news that I will be in the Relieving Principal role for the rest of term. Ms Evans will steer the KS ship for the remainder of term 1. One of the best things about being Principal is moving around the whole school and visiting classrooms to see the learning our students are engaging in. From the music room, to a phonics lesson in Kindergarten to a challenging lesson on length in stage 3, the rooms are a buzz with learning.

Year 3 and 5 students have sat NAPLAN tests this week, providing our school with important information on how we can best cater for our learners. All students worked hard to complete their tests and we congratulate them on their hard work. School times: please be aware the school bell goes at 9:10am. Teachers are on duty from 8:45am in the morning. They often arrive early to attend school meetings and set up for their day. We do not provide before or after school care services. A large number of children are at school quite early, unsupervised. Unless your child catches a bus, which drops them off early, attends early music lessons with Mrs Moore or has made prior organisation regarding work commitments, they should not be on site until 8:45am.

Our whole school assemblies are held fortnightly on Friday afternoons commencing at 2:40pm. This week's spotlight will be the cute KM, so that is one to look forward to!

Do you have a spare yellow hat at home? Ms Evans and Mrs Moloney would love to see their supply of spare yellow hats replenished please, so if they could be sent in to school, that would be fantastic.

All students items, such as hats, lunch boxes, drink bottles, and jumpers need to be labelled with names to avoid lots of lost property at the end of term!

While on the topic of jumpers, all students are required to wear a blue school jumper to school as the weather turns cooler. These are available to purchase at the front office, but there is also a big supply at the op-shops around town if you prefer to thrift for one.

One of my favourite days on our school calendar is the Easter Hat Parade, which will be held next Thursday at 9.30am (26th March). This event is K-6 and all students are encouraged to make a hat at home and wear it for the parade. Happy Easter and see you there!

This Friday, 22nd March, we will celebrate Harmony Day. Students can wear orange clothes, please ensure shoulders are suitably covered and wear closed in shoes. Created in 1999 to celebrate unity and diversity, Harmony Day was originally an Australian celebration but is now marked worldwide by people everywhere.
